

Reflection

The Book of Wisdom tells us that God did not make death; death was the consequence of the sin of Adam and Eve. Therefore God does not delight in the death of the sinner. Jesus the Son of God in his compassion did not delight in human afflictions. After calming the storm on the sea, he manifested his divine powers again in restoring life to one woman who had been “socially dead” for twelve years because of her hemorrhage sickness, and a girl who was physically dead at twelve years of age. The two miracles show us what can happen when people really put their trust in the Lord.

The gospel narrative is about three people who were desperately in need of Jesus’ healing power: the Synagogue official Jairus who was in danger of losing his beloved daughter, the twelve year old daughter of Jairus who was about to die, and the woman in the crowd who became an outcast because of her 12 years of hemorrhages. When someone is in desperate situation especially when it involves suffering and death, the person can go beyond the confines of the law and status to save the awful predicament. Jairus despite his position was bold enough to approach Jesus directly to plead for his dying daughter. He fell at Jesus’ feet and pleaded earnestly with him, saying “My daughter is at the point of death. Please come, lay your hands on her that she may get well and live.” Jesus was moved by compassion by his humility and followed the official to his house.

On the way to Jairus’ house, Jesus encountered another woman who, in her desperate need to be cured, defied the law that forbade her from public appearance, touched the fringe of Jesus cloak, and instantly she was healed. Under the Jewish law this woman was considered unclean. Therefore she was forbidden to go to the Temple to worship or to have any physical contact with anyone. She was “socially dead”. But the unbounded compassion, faith, and power from Christ instantly restored her to life. Jesus moved on to the house of Jairus who was told that his daughter just passed away. Jesus said to him, “Do not be afraid; just have faith.” The faith of Jairus and the healing power of Christ restored the twelve year old back to life.



Their faith saved and healed them from further sickness and death. Their faith gives testimony that their helplessness and surrender to God’s power allowed Jesus to do His miracles. It was this faith which touched Jesus and moved him to grant their wishes. For us who believe, the miracles of Jesus are signs of great hope in the midst of hopelessness. The miracles were meant precisely to teach us to believe that the same wonders would one day, unfailingly be worked for us. Jesus invites us to have faith in Him which transcends present suffering and future death. He invites us to bear the fruits of the Spirit of peace and joy as we place our complete trust in Him. No matter what we suffer, even death; He invites us to abandon ourselves to Him with total and confident trust.

Sign a Petition Against AB 775 Right Now!

A California committee has approved a bill that would force pregnancy centers to provide women with abortion alternatives or refer women for abortions.

AB 775, the Pregnancy Counseling Discrimination Rule, would require all pregnancy centers to promote abortions to their clients. There is no conscience clause or opt out for centers that provide pregnant women assistance without abortions or abortion referrals. Failure to comply carries a \$500 fine for first offense and \$1,000 for each subsequent offense. The bill authorizes the Attorney General, city attorney, or county counsel to impose the civil fines.

Mensaje para Reflexionar

La Presencia Sanadora de Jesús

"En esta lectura del Santo Evangelio, dos personas llegan con semejantes situaciones de terrible necesidad. La hija de Jairo está enferma. Mientras Jesús y la multitud se dirigen hacia la casa de Jairo, una mujer que está enferma y sufre de hemorragia por doce años y desesperada por una curación, logra tocar la ropa de Jesús.

Jesús continúa su caminata para curar a la hija de Jairo, pero durante el viaje un reporte llega que la niña ya está muerta. Las tempestades, enfermedad, y ahora muerte ha pasado a ser la tensión por su amado, y calmado contacto.

A pesar de las objeciones de la apenada multitud y las risas de burla cuando Él les dice que la pequeña no está muerta, sino dormida, Jesús entra a la casa, ora unas palabras curativas, anuncia su deseo para que la niña "se levante" y ella lo hace.

Estas tres escenas empiezan el despliegue del Evangelio de San Marcos, en el cual Jesús es el Señor de toda la creación y su dominio es vivir la vida más libremente tal y como fue creada originalmente. Jesús realiza su trabajo trayendo vida de regreso a la existencia real. Jairo y la mujer con enfermedad, vienen a Jesús en condiciones de cuerpo y espíritu que ambos desean fuesen diferentes.

Uno tiene a una hija enferma, el otro se encuentra enfermo, pero ambos prefieren encontrar a Jesús como espectadores de otra clase de acontecimiento o curando otro cuerpo que no sea el suyo propio. Jesús los ama de la manera que él los encuentra, pero los ama también lo suficiente para no dejarlos de la misma manera él los ha encontrado.... Jesús es nuestra revolución, nuestra declaración por la independencia de la oscuridad, y de la dominación de lo puramente físico. Nuestra celebración de Fe es recordar quienes somos a través de su contacto."
