## Reflection

We celebrate today the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist, the sacrament of all sacraments. This solemnity originated in Liege, Belgium in the mid-thirteenth century, but was decreed a universal celebration by Pope Urban IV on August 11, 1264, in the Bull “**Transiturus De Hoc Mundo**” (As he was about to pass on from this world). In it, the Pope had written: “Even though the Eucharist is solemnly celebrated every day of the year, on one day we pay special honor to the Body of Christ. We may, of course, invoke the Lord with our minds and our spirits at any time, but we do not in this way obtain the Real Presence of Christ. With the Eucharistic commemoration, however, Jesus Christ is actually present with us in his own substance.” The Pope also commissioned St Thomas Aquinas to compose the prayers for the Mass and Liturgy of the Hours for this solemnity. St Thomas also composed the famous “*Pange Lingua Gloriosi* and the *Tantum Ergo Sacramentum*.” This feast is celebrated on the Thursday following the Trinity Sunday or, as in the United States, on the Sunday after Trinity Sunday.

We hear in the second reading of today what St. Paul wrote in his first letter to the Corinthians the words of Christ at the Last Supper: “This is my body that is for you. Do this in remembrance of me...” “This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.” The words clearly show Jesus’ gift of Himself to us in the Holy Eucharist. The institution of the Holy Eucharist is His “last will and testament” to the Church. It is an everlasting covenant established by Christ. When the priest repeats the words of Christ over the wine at Mass, “This is my blood of the covenant,” He is making present through the power of his ordination the reality of the eternal redemption which Christ won for us.

The Mass and Holy Communion are the full participation in the re-enactment of Calvary. This re-enactment of the death (and resurrection) of Christ is to be continued until Christ returns on the last day. By offering the Mass we are giving infinite honor and satisfaction to God, and by receiving what is sacrificed we become intimately united with God and with one another, we are members of the one family of God, part-



aking of the same divine meal. In the early Church, the community participation in the Eucharistic sacrifice was stressed and practiced very much. Today, the Church continues to stress on active participation at Mass, in the offering of Christ’s sacrifice to the Father. The Church also emphasizes that the ideal to be aimed at is that everyone present at the Mass should also gather around the communion table and take part in the community, sacrificial meal. This will then strengthen the bonds of love that unite them with God and with one another. Christ had already instituted another powerful sacrament of reconciliation to enable us prepare ourselves spiritually for proper participation at Mass and partaking of his Body and Blood. The Eucharistic procession that takes place after the Mass is a sign of common faith and adoration, a pledge of undivided love and total commitment to him.


