
## Reflection

The first and the third readings of this Sunday have two parallel stories that touch directly on God's compassionate and healing love on the world full of broken hearts and miseries. In the first reading, Elijah, a very powerful prophet in the Old Testament, through the power of God, restored the life of the only son of the Widow of Zarephath of Sidon who had given him accommodation during the famine in Israel, thus bringing consolation and comfort to the poor widow.

In the Gospel, we read that Jesus was making a journey to the city of Nain. As he was about to enter the city, he met a very sorrowful widow whose only son had died and was being carried to his burial place. Jesus was moved with pity when he saw the weeping widow. He stopped the funeral procession, stepped forward and touched the coffin and said, "Young man, I tell you, arise!" The young man sat up and began to speak. Jesus gave him to his mother alive, thus extending the healing compassion to the grieving widow and transforming her despair and sorrow.

These two readings challenge us to become the channels of God's compassionate and healing love and to place our hope in Jesus who, with his touch of kindness raises us from all our hopelessness and miseries of this world to the new life of joy and happiness. At each celebration of Mass, we bring our shattered lives, our broken hearts, our anger, our depression, and our deepest hurts to the foot of the Altar, where we ask the Lord to grant us his loving mercy and healing.

What St Paul wrote in his letter to the Galatians in our second reading today, forms the second part of our reflection. St Paul declared that the Good News of God's love, mercy and salvation which he preached had been directly revealed to him by God, who had chosen him for ministry from his mother's womb. This text points directly to what the sacred priesthood, which our pastor and spiritual director, Fr. Robert Victoria, has spent twenty-five years of his life, is all about. Every priest is chosen by God to preach the Good News of God's love, mercy and salvation. It is an unmerited office bestowed on humans as a privilege. A priest is not his own, he is chosen from among the people. For 'by sacred ordination and the mission they receive from their bishops, priests



are promoted to the service of Christ the Teacher, Priest and King. They share in his ministry of unceasingly building up the Church on earth into the people of God, the Body of Christ and the Temple of the Holy Spirit.' The dominant gospel images of the ideal or excellence of the Catholic priesthood is that he is a servant of Christ, a disciple of Christ, an apostle and ambassador of Christ, a steward of God's mysteries, and an overseer of the Christian community. For twenty-five years as a priest, Fr. Robert has lived his priestly ministry in the light of these images. He has distinguished himself, a priest, a pastor of souls and a true servant of Christ. We congratulate him and wish him many more years of fruitful service in the Lord's vineyard.
