## Reflection

Today's Gospel reading begins with the journey of Jesus to Jerusalem, which will end with his ministry in Jerusalem. Jesus ministry begins in Galilee and then is one long journey to Jerusalem. In Jerusalem he will meet his death but also enter into his glory. Only in Luke we read that Jesus spend 40 days in Jerusalem instructing his disciples. It is in Jerusalem that his disciples wait after his Ascension to be sent the Holy Spirit on Pentecost. And it is from Jerusalem, that the Good News is spread to Rome and the ends of the earth.

Immediately Jesus is met with rejection, as a Samaritan village will not receive him because he is going to Jerusalem. There was animosity between Samaritans who worshiped on Mount Gerazim and Jews who worshiped in Jerusalem. Jesus was also rejected as he began his ministry in Galilee. And he will be rejected for the last time when he reaches Jerusalem. James and John want to call down fire from heaven to destroy the people in the village, but Jesus rebukes them and moves on. There is often the temptation to use violence to achieve right. Jesus has come to break this temptation. He is aware that he must undergo violence himself before he can enter his glory.

The rest of today's reading is about the radical demands of discipleship. The three people who volunteer to become disciples on this journey show that they do not understand the demands Jesus will make of them. Neither care of self, care for the dead, nor care of one's family can come before the demands of discipleship. Jesus reminds the first volunteer, who would go wherever Jesus goes, that animals in the wild have more security than do Jesus and his followers. The second, who wants to bury a parent, is reminded that the demands of proclaiming the Kingdom of God take precedence. And the third, who wants to say farewell to his family, is reminded that once you put your hand to the plow you

what he asks of himself. Jesus' unconditional commitment to God's saving work will demand of him his life. He knows this, but the disciples do not understand. Jesus does not want anyone to rush into discipleship, because the demands of discipleship require everyone considering it to be aware of the cost, make Jesus and his mission central to his life, and then go forward without looking backing back.

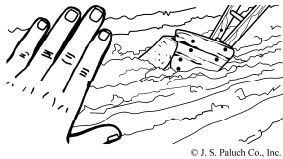

## **Mensaje para Reflexionar**

En el Evangelio de hoy, San Lucas relata lo que ocurre de camino hacia Jerusalén. Y siempre reaparece la misma resolución que guía a Jesús. Cuando le advierten que Herodes quiere matarlo, no logran disuadirlo de su propósito. La subida de Jesús a Jerusalén, desde la Galilea, fue pasando a través de Samaría. Existían hostilidades entre judíos y samaritanos, porque éstos tenían su propio culto considerado cismático por parte de los judíos. Por eso los samaritanos no daban facilidades a los peregrinos que pasaban por su territorio para ir a adorar a Jerusalén.

Su destino final de Jesús es el Templo de Jerusalén, el mismo lugar al que había sido presentado por sus padres cuarenta días después de su nacimiento y donde se había quedado instruyendo a los doctores de la ley a los doce años. Jesús ya no saldrá de Jerusalén, pues allí será su muerte, su resurrección y las apariciones a los discípulos.

Sabemos que cuando Pedro quiso hacerlo reconsiderar su decisión de ir a Jerusalén, Jesús lo rechazó severamente. Él trataba de cumplir su misión, de abrazar la cruz para llevar hasta el extremo su amor al Padre y su amor a los hombres y nada podía detenerlo. Y en esto consiste también la vocación cristiana. Para seguir a Cristo hay que «endurecer el rostro» es decir «mostrar el semblante decidido» y actuar como Él cuando se encaminó a Jerusalén. La esencia del seguimiento de Cristo es una determinación al amor y nada más. Cualquiera otra motivación es inaceptable. El resto del Evangelio nos narra, por medio del relato de tres vocaciones reales, en qué consiste en concreto «negarse a sí mismo y seguir a Jesús».

En el primer caso, a uno que expresa su intención de seguirlo, Jesús le advierte que hay que estar dispuesto a privarse de todas las comodidades. A un segundo, que pide licencia para enterrar a su padre, Jesús le dice que para este seguimiento hay que estar dispuesto a abandonar todos los afectos, incluso los afectos familiares. Por último a uno que pide un tiempo para despedirse de los suyos, Jesús le expresa la urgencia y radicalidad exigidas. Cuando Cristo llama, él exige la misma disponibilidad que admiramos en sus apóstoles: «Dejándolo todo, lo siguieron». Ninguno de estos tres episodios tiene desenlace. El Evangelio no nos dice si esos tres se alejaron «tristes porque tenían muchos bienes» o si «dejándolo todo, llenos de gozo, lo siguieron». Pero no hace falta que se nos diga el desenlace, pues en la vida real, en nuestro mismo tiempo, vemos casi a diario la reacción de diversos jóvenes ante el llamado de Dios: algunos, dispuestos a sufrir la misma suerte que Cristo, lo siguen; otros, muchos, prefieren tener asegurado un lugar dónde reclinar la cabeza y gozar del afecto de los suyos y se alejan de Cristo tristes.

Cristo es la única VERDAD, el único CAMINO y la única VIDA. Todo lo que se oponga a Él, es mentira. Todo lo que se aparte de él es perderse. Y todo lo que no sea vivir con Él es la muerte eterna.

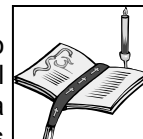
### **Nuestra Misión:**

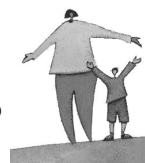
### **Clases de Verano**
