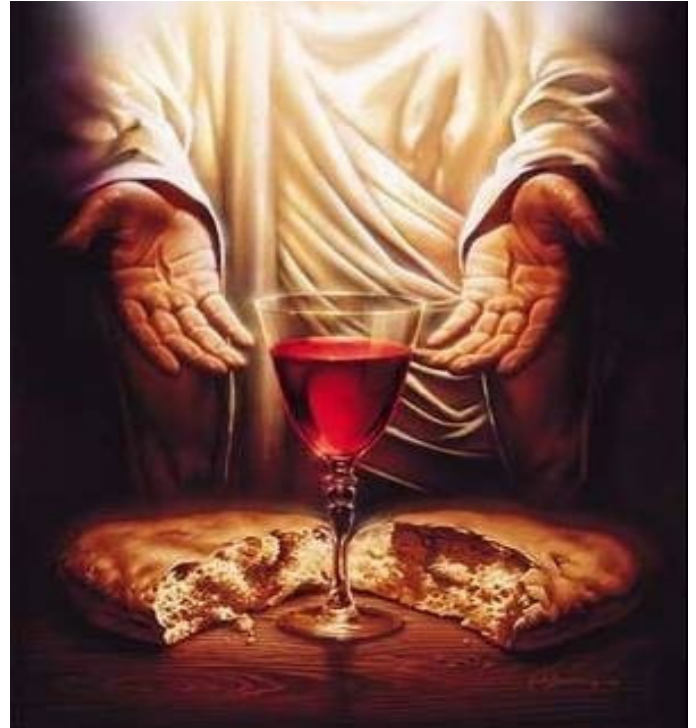

### Reflection Corner

All of us together form the Church. Who is the center or head of the Church? Jesus is the center. How is Jesus most present to us? In the Blessed Sacrament. Today's celebration of Corpus Christi, the Body of Christ, is the feast of the very center and heart of our church, the center and heart of our faith, and the center and heart of parish, the center and heart of the lives of each of us, Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament.

I know that some find it difficult to believe that bread and wine change into the Body and Blood of Jesus. I can understand your doubts. We don't see any change in the bread or wine. There is no difference in the taste; the bread still tastes like bread and the wine still tastes like wine. It is going against logic to say that the bread and wine change into the Body and Blood of Jesus despite no change in appearance. With our intellect we can understand that God must be keeping the universe together, that God is the origin of everything, but reason will only take us so far. Then we need to add faith to our reason and intellect. As Paul says, in the Christian life we go by faith and not by sight (2 Cor 5:7). We need to be humble and open to God performing a miracle every day in this church, the miracle of the Eucharist. Can you be humble enough to add faith to your intellect and reason, to admit that intellect by itself does not provide all the answers, and that God can perform miracles every day making it possible for bread and wine to become the Body and Blood of Jesus while keeping the same appearance? Can you add faith to your intellect? When you submit to God you will not lose anything, you will gain everything. There is a beautiful chant, "Trust, surrender, believe, receive." Add faith to your reasoning and receive the love of God for you! The Eucharist is the gift of God's love for you.

The Eucharist is a celebration of the love of Jesus for us, his blood shed for us in love and his body scourged, crowned with thorns and crucified for us. The wine poured and the bread broken is the love of Jesus for us, body and blood given for us. Because the Eucharist is the love of Jesus for us we always approach Jesus in the Eucharist with great respect and asking pardon for



our sins. That's why it is so necessary at the start of every Mass to ask Jesus for mercy because we are so unworthy of his love, and again before receiving Jesus we express our unworthiness, "Lord I am not worthy to receive you but only say the word and I shall be healed." Think of how precious a moment in our Mass it is when we receive Jesus in Holy Communion. When we receive Jesus, Jesus is in us and we are with Jesus.

Remember the words of the consecration of every Mass recalling Jesus giving himself for us, "This is my Body which will be given up for you....This is the cup of my blood. It will be shed for you..."

May Jesus in the Eucharist always be the very center and heart of our church, the center and heart of our faith, the center and heart of our parish, and the center and heart of the lives of each of us.

#### Talk to your teens about handling workplace violence

Many teens will get their first job while still in high school. Building a work ethic is a great and necessary skill, but teens need to be informed to about how best to handle possible workplace violence. Coworkers are not always thoroughly screened, and your teen could face another employee's rage or anger that could possible put them in danger. Talk to your teens about warning signs-short tempers, intimidation, drug use—and about how to remove themselves when they feel unsafe in a situation, and how to report any concerns they have, to a safe adult. ## Mensaje para Reflexionar

Hoy la iglesia celebra *La Fiesta del Santísimo Cuerpo o Corpus Christi y la Santísima Sangre de Cristo*. Esta fiesta es importante para nosotros, porque a través del Cuerpo y Sangre de Cristo recibimos la plenitud de vida.

En una aldea, un templo pagano se encuentra al costado de una Iglesia Católica. Cada día, un Pagano y un Católico caminan en la misma dirección hacia sus respectivos lugares de culto. El pagano observa que el católico nunca lleva una ofrenda a la iglesia. El le pregunta, "¿Cómo es que ustedes los Católicos no ofrecen nada cuando usted asisten a su Misa"? "Nuestra religión es diferente," responde el católico. "Ustedes paganos están obligados a ofrecer a su Dios cada vez que lo veneran. Para nosotros los católicos, siempre que celebramos la Santa Misa, nuestro Dios se ofrece a nosotros".

Jesús dijo, "Yo soy el pan vivo que desciende de los cielos; quienquiera que come este pan vivirá para siempre. El pan que les daré es mi cuerpo y lo daré por la vida de la palabra" (*Juan.6:51*). El se ofrece a nosotros con amor cada vez que nosotros celebramos la Misa.

Es en el compartir su cuerpo y su sangre que realizamos lo que Jesús nos pidió; compartir su regalo de vida!
