## Reflection Corner

With the advent of Pentecost, which is 50 days after Easter, the church has traditionally also celebrated not only its birth day, but the weekly Lord's Day on a Sunday. We celebrate Eucharist on Sunday, then as a reminder of the first creation and of the second creation. The Holy Spirit that stirred the waters of creation returned to us on Pentecost making a new creation, her church, and making us new creatures because of the Resurrection.

Although today is the reminder of starting something new, it is also an ending. Today we end the Easter season. The Easter candle which has been burning since Easter to remind us of the light that has come into the world, will be set aside and used only of there is a baptism. Next week we continue what is called "Ordinary Time" which simply means that the joyous feasts have ended, and we go back to the Gospel of Luke and continue to read the story of Jesus, focusing primarily on his teachings and parables.

The Apostles and followers of Jesus were locked up in a room, frightened and confused, but awaiting something that had been promised them. When the Holy Spirit came, it came as tongues of fire, light and energy which caused all of them to see in the light and be the light in so many ways. They began to speak in such a way that people could understand them in any language. The frightened followers all were energized and were given gifts to be able to go out and preach the message of Christ. Peter, in particular, preaches a moving homily using the Jewish prophet Joel to explain what had happened to them: the Spirit was causing them to dream dreams, see visions and prophesy. The church was alive and energized!

So then Pentecost is the celebration of the coming of the Holy Spirit energizing the church and sending its members forth to live and preach the good news of Jesus. Our readings and hymns today explain what the Spirit is and what the Spirit means. God sends the Spirit in Jesus' name. We are told that the Spirit can teach us all things and remind us of all that Jesus



taught us. For this reason we need to have faith in the Spirit and leave ourselves open to its work.

It is most important for us to remember that the Spirit is God's gift to us, the Spirit is with us, the Spirit can help us grow, guide us, help us to become a better persons, help us make right decisions, give us strength when we are down or bad things happen to us, and so much more. So it is time today to celebrate those gifts, that loving God has given us, and to become more aware of the power that we have through the Spirit. In everything you do, the Spirit is with you. Listen to her!

### Ongoing CASE Collection

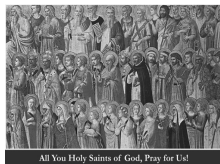

#### Did you know?

**Viewing pornography can put children in greater danger of abuse**



In a recent report on the role technology plays in sex trafficking, researchers discovered that the internet facilitated prostitution through online ads in 75% of cases. The average age of entry was 15. Pornography is a growing problem in our society, and it contributes a great deal to the real problems of sexual exploitation and trafficking that are happening closer to home than we may think. Pornography portrays sex as violent and degrading, particularly to women. Viewing these images can make children more vulnerable to sexual abuse, since they can have a distorted view of what is appropriate and what's not. ## **Mensaje para Reflexionar**

En cierta ocasión unos jóvenes se acercaron a un sacerdote para decirle que si podían orar por él para que recibiera el Espíritu Santo. El sacerdote les dio una catequesis en torno a los sacramentos y cómo, por medio de ellos, recibimos la infusión del Espíritu Santo. “Lo recibí en mi Bautismo, en la Confirmación y también cuando fui ordenado sacerdote”. Los jóvenes replicaron: “está bien, padre. ¿Podemos orar para que se le note el Espíritu Santo?”

El hecho de que el Espíritu Santo no se manifieste en las personas como queremos que se manifieste, no significa que no lo tienen. Después de todo, el Espíritu Santo también es silencio y paz. Pensamos que porque una persona no es dinámica, que no canta, que no baila o que no da vueltas de un lado para otro, no tiene el Espíritu Santo. Si pensamos así, tenemos una percepción muy pobre del Espíritu Santo. Si seguimos pensando así, quizá ninguno de los grandes místicos tuvieron el Espíritu Santo.

Por otra parte, si tenemos el Espíritu Santo en nosotros, el Espíritu Santo se manifestara de acuerdo a nuestros “dones” o regalos recibidos. ¡Ven ya, dador de los siete dones! Y si no se manifiesta no significa que no exista.

Después de la muerte de Cristo, la primera Iglesia, se quedó aguardando al Espíritu Santo. Mientras tanto, se reunían a puerta cerrada, tenían miedo y no sabían qué hacer. Pero la infusión del Espíritu Santo vino a cambiar esa realidad de miedo. A partir de Pentecostés aquellos discípulos y discípulas salieron a la calle animados por un fuego que ardía en sus huesos y que no podían apagar, un fuego como el que sintió el profeta Jeremías, que les aprisionaba los huesos, y entonces predicaron ardientemente el nombre de Jesús a todas las gentes. Cuando recibieron al Espíritu Santo se liberaron de su miedo y no temieron ni siquiera a la muerte. El Espíritu es tan, pero tan fuerte, que quienes lo tienen, no tienen miedo a nada, ni siquiera a morir.

El Espíritu Santo tiene muchísimos dones, no sólo los siete que nos señala el Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica: sabiduría, inteligencia, consejo, fortaleza, ciencia, piedad y temor de Dios. La caridad, San Pablo lo ha dicho, está por encima de todos estos dones. El don más importante, pues, no es el don de lenguas, sino el de la caridad.

Al final, el don de lenguas no sólo es una expresión verbal que es posible que no entendamos, sino que es hablar de tal manera que todos entiendan lo que decimos, porque nuestra palabra no necesariamente es verbal, sino que nuestra vida se hace una misma palabra o un mensaje del Espíritu que el día de hoy da vida a la Iglesia, porque somos una Iglesia que nace en el costado de Cristo y que se renueva en la venida del Espíritu Santo.

¡Ven, Espíritu Santo!

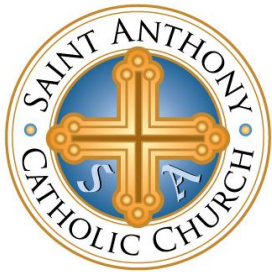
