## Reflection Corner

This week we return to the liturgical season of Ordinary Time. This Sunday and next Sunday, however, are designated as solemnities, special days that call our attention to central mysteries of our faith. Today, on the first Sunday after Pentecost, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. This feast invites us to consider what we believe about God, who has revealed himself to us in the Trinity - one God in three persons. "We believe in one God, the Father almighty." "We believe in Jesus Christ His only-begotten Son, our Lord." "We believe in the Holy Spirit."

The verses of today's Gospel come near the end of Jesus' long discourse at the Last Supper. In the early part of this discourse, as we saw last week on Pentecost, Jesus offers assurances to the disciples. Even though he must leave the disciples, he tells them that they will have a future because of the help he will send them in the Holy Spirit. In this section he focuses more on the shape of the future, which will include Jesus' victory over the world that they will share in. The disciples of Jesus cannot know the future. They can only know that, whatever shape the future takes, they will not have to face it alone. They have the Spirit of Truth, who will continue to provide the teaching of Jesus in the future.

Reading this passage on Trinity Sunday reinforces our understanding of the unity shared by the members of the Trinity. Although the idea of one God in three persons remains a mystery, we have the assurance that, as Jesus and the Father share all, Jesus and the Spirit share all. Think of the last time you witnessed an act of selfless love in your family. Parents and caregivers of all kinds are called upon to act selflessly every day. Family life calls us to share selfless love with one another.

God is the model of selfless love for us. There was no need for God to create our planet or the creatures that inhabit it; it was an act of selfless love. There was also no need for God to send his only Son to save us. That too was an act of selfless love.



As we draw closer to God and the mystery of the Trinity, we learn about God's love. God has lavished us with love in the persons of the Son and the Spirit, who in turn nurture in us the desire to do the same. When we open ourselves to be filled with an awareness of the divine life within us, we participate in the endless spiral of love that leads to eternal life. Whenever we share selfless love in the family, we are sharing in the life of the Trinity.

So let us celebrate the Trinity, as the life that we must lead. It is the giving of ourselves; it is the forgiving of God that we share with each other. And this is what makes life with God eternal. To be one with Him is to love each other and to experience the eternity of God's life, one with the Father, one with the Son and filled with the Holy Spirit.

"Gloria al Padre, gloria al Hijo y gloria al Espíritu Santo": cada vez que proclamamos estas palabras, síntesis de nuestra fe, adoramos al único y verdadero Dios en tres Personas. Contemplamos con estupor este misterio que nos envuelve totalmente. Misterio de amor; misterio de santidad inefable.

Si miramos el mar inmenso, ¿que adivinamos detrás de aquella cinta azul que se pierde en la lejanía?... Si miramos al cielo en la noche callada, ¿cuando llegamos al final de aquella infinidad de estrellas?...

### **Protegiendo a los Niños Sabía usted?**

#### **El ciberacoso podría estar afectando a su hijo/a**

En el verano, es posible que los niños pasen más tiempo hablando en línea con amigos y compartiendo actualizaciones en las redes sociales, jugando y más. El Internet es una excelente manera de mantenerse en contacto con los compañeros de clase mientras están de vacaciones, pero también es un espacio donde el comportamiento cruel y de acoso, o "bullying", puede ser desenfrenado. Hable con sus hijos sobre la seguridad en Internet, y esté atento/a para saber con quién se comunican y cómo están actuando. Si su hijo se ve triste o deprimido, podría ser una señal de que está siendo víctima de acoso. A diferencia de cuando sus hijos están en la escuela, ellos no pueden alejarse del acoso cibernético y los mensajes dañinos pueden propagarse rápidamente. Como padres de familia, manténganse al tanto de los sitios que usan sus hijos y si es necesario, monitoree abiertamente las conversaciones y los mensajes.
