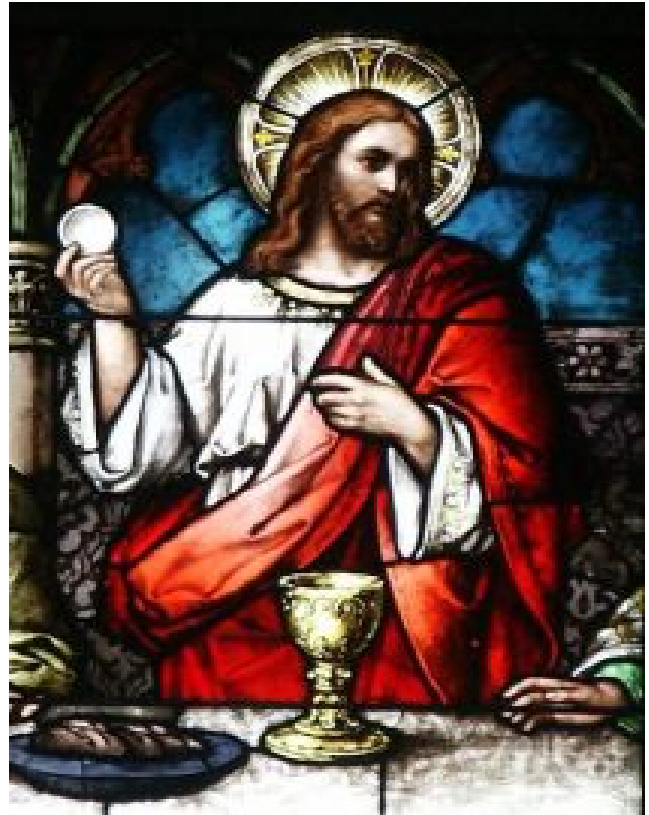
Reflection Corner

All of us together form the Church. Who is the center or head of the Church? Jesus is the center. How is Jesus most present to us? In the Blessed Sacrament. Today's celebration of Corpus Christ, the Body of Christ, is the feast of the very center and heart of our church, the center and heart of our faith, and the center and heart of parish, Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament.

I know that some find it difficult to believe that bread and wine change into the Body and Blood of Jesus. We don't see any change in the bread or wine. There is no difference in the taste; the bread still tastes like bread and the wine still tastes like wine. It is going against logic to say that the bread and wine change into the Body and Blood of Jesus despite no change in appearance.

To help us believe, from time to time, God has allowed visible miracles of the Eucharist to occur, Eucharistic Miracles as we call them. These are miracles that occurred during Mass when the bread changed into the form of flesh during the consecration and the wine changed into the form of blood during the consecration. Many such Eucharistic Miracles have occurred in various parts of the world and throughout the two millennia of Christian history and have been authenticated by the Church. In the year 1263 a priest from Prague was on route to Rome making a pilgrimage asking God for help to strengthen his faith since he was having doubts about his vocation. Along the way he stopped in Bolsena 70 miles north of Rome. While celebrating Mass there, as he raised the host during the consecration, the bread turned into flesh and began to bleed. The drops of blood fell onto the small white cloth on the altar, called the corporal. The following year, 1264, Pope Urban IV instituted the feast of the Body and Blood of Jesus, today's feast, Corpus Christi.

The Eucharist is a celebration of the love of Jesus for us, his blood shed for us in love and his body scourged, crowned with thorns and crucified for us. The wine poured and the bread broken is the love of Jesus for us, body and blood given for us. Because the



Eucharist is the love of Jesus for us we always approach Jesus in the Eucharist with great respect and asking pardon for our sins. That's why it is so necessary at the start of every Mass to ask Jesus for mercy because we are so unworthy of his love, and again before receiving Jesus we express our unworthiness, "Lord I am not worthy to receive you but only say the word and I shall be healed." Think of how precious a moment in our Mass it is when we receive Jesus in Holy Communion.

May Jesus in the Eucharist always be the very center and heart of our church, the center and heart of our faith, the center and heart of our parish, and the center and heart of the lives of each of us.

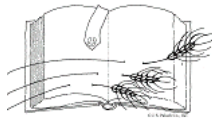

Welcome back!

We are very blessed that our Church has reopened. **Our weekday Masses are Monday, Wednesday, Friday and Saturday at 8:00am and on Tuesday and Thursday at 12:10pm. No reservations are needed for weekday Masses.**

We will continue to livestream masses daily during the week at 12:10pm as well as our 3:00pm Divine Mercy Devotion and the Holy Rosary.

Reservations are required for our Sunday Masses. Reservations are available for the 8:00am, 10:00am, 12:00pm (Spanish), 1:30pm (Latin) and 5pm Masses.

There is no Saturday Vigil 5pm Mass at this time. We can only accommodate 84 people per mass.

We will continue to livestream Sunday mass at 10:00am and 12:00pm in Spanish.

The Dispensation from Mass is still in effect, especially for those over 65, and for those who have underlying conditions or have any cold/flu like symptoms.

Our Eucharistic Chapel is open for personal prayer during office hours Monday through Thursday from 9:00am to 12:00pm and in the afternoon from 12:45 to 4:45pm. Please call for reservation as we need social distance. We can only accommodate four people at a time. Face covering is required to attend mass and to pray in our Eucharistic chapel.

Safeguard The Children Did you know?



Teach children everyday actions to reduce the spread of germs

It is appropriate to frequently remind your children about ways to avoid or reduce the spread of germs and to start practicing at home. Among the tips are: Stay away from people who are coughing, sneezing or sick. Remind them to cough or sneeze into a tissue or their elbow, then throw the tissue into the trash. Get the children into a handwashing habit. Teach them to wash their hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after blowing their nose, coughing, or sneezing; going to the bathroom; and before eating or preparing food. If soap and water are not available, teach them to use hand sanitizer. Hand sanitizer should contain at least 60% alcohol. Supervise young children when they use hand sanitizer to prevent swallowing alcohol. Mensaje para Reflexionar

El que come mi carne y bebe mi sangre tendrá vida eterna. Estas palabras del evangelio de San Juan nos introducen en el misterio de la presencia Eucarística que celebramos en esta solemnidad. La liturgia nos ofrece tres elementos que orientan nuestra reflexión: la experiencia del desierto del pueblo de Israel, el alimento del camino y la vida que no es derrotada por la muerte. El libro del Deuteronomio evoca el paso del pueblo por el desierto. Este memorial tiene el objeto de despertar la responsabilidad de los oyentes con respecto a las tareas presentes. La historia enseña al pueblo de Israel que su paso por el desierto, lleno de adversidades y contratiempos, no es simplemente una situación ciega, ajena a todo sentido y significado, sino un momento de prueba. Un momento en el que Dios penetra el corazón, se hace presente y ofrece el sustento a los que desfallecen. Yahvé sale al paso de sus necesidades y les da el maná.

Este alimento que el Señor ofrece en el desierto sostiene la vida del pueblo y lo ayuda a continuar la marcha. Así como en el pasado, Israel atravesó por el desierto y Dios probó su corazón y lo mantuvo en vida, así ahora, en el presente de nuestras vidas el Señor no es ajeno a la suerte humana. En verdad, Dios es amigo la vida y no odia nada de cuanto ha creado. Esta verdad encuentra su plenitud en Cristo que ha venido para que tengamos vida y la tengamos en abundancia. Por eso nos da a comer su carne, verdadera comida, y a beber su sangre, verdadera bebida, para que tengamos vida eterna. Participando todos de un solo pan (Eucarístico) formamos un solo cuerpo.

El evangelio de hoy nos menciona que Jesús mismo es el pan de vida: su carne es verdadera comida y su sangre verdadera bebida y sólo el que come su carne y bebe su sangre tiene vida eterna. Se trata de un lenguaje muy realista que llama la atención. El evangelista hablando de este modo, quiere dar a entender que el pan eucarístico es "verdaderamente" el cuerpo de Cristo y el vino consagrado es "verdaderamente" la sangre de Cristo. Quien come este cuerpo y bebe esta sangre tiene la vida eterna y la promesa de Cristo de que lo resucitará el último día.

El sacramento de la Eucaristía es el sacramento que nos hace más patente el "amor hasta el fin" de Cristo Señor. En la Eucaristía encontramos la vida, en la Eucaristía encontramos las fuerzas para seguir el camino, en la Eucaristía encontramos al amigo incomparable de nuestras almas que está allí siempre para escucharnos y ofrecernos su amistad. Podemos atravesar ya cualquier desierto, podemos ser puestos a prueba por innumerables adversidades, en la Eucaristía encontraremos las fuerzas necesarias para superar el combate.

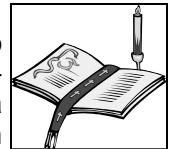


La Parroquia de San Antonio Nuestra Misión:

Protegiendo a los Niños Sabía usted?

Enseñe a sus hijos actividades diarias para reducir la propagación de los gérmenes



Siempre es apropiado recordarles a sus hijos con frecuencia las formas de evitar o reducir la propagación de los gérmenes para que los empiecen a practicar en el hogar. Entre los consejos están: Alejarse de las personas que estén tosiendo, estornudando o enfermas. Recuérdeles que ellos mismos deben toser o estornudar siempre tapándose la boca con un pañuelo de papel o colocando su boca sobre su codo, y que luego deben tirar el pañuelo de papel a la basura. Enseñe a sus hijos a desarrollar el hábito de lavarse las manos con frecuencia. Enséñeles a lavarse las manos con agua y jabón durante por lo menos 20 segundos, especialmente después de que se suenen la nariz, después de toser o de estornudar; de ir al baño; y antes de comer o de preparar la comida. Si no hay agua y jabón disponible, enséñeles cómo usar los desinfectantes de manos. Estos desinfectantes deben contener al menos 60 por ciento de alcohol. Supervise a los niños pequeños cuando usen el desinfectante de manos para prevenir que traguen alcohol.
