

## Reflection Corner

***“The Lord is kind and merciful...slow to anger.”***

This is the refrain from our beautiful psalm today. So, what makes us angry? I know people who are angry all the time. Everything seems to make them angry – the political situation, religion, their bosses and authority, and all the little annoyances that go along with a daily routine. I feel very sorry for such people. It is like the joy has gone out of their lives. Does anger sometimes control your life? Sirach, in the First Reading, calls anger an abomination. His answer to controlling anger seems to be first, an awareness of our death and corruption, and secondly, awareness that in this present life we are to obey God’s commands and so, must put aside anger in atonement for our own sins, and pardon the sins and transgressions of others. “It is in pardoning that we are pardoned” says the Song of St. Francis. Sirach would agree. So it is important that we not get uptight over the things others do that anger us, and instead, see them in such a way that we can empathize with them, understand their point of view and forgive them their faults and transgressions against us. We must learn to be more like God – kind, merciful and slow to anger.

St. Paul, in our second reading today stresses the fact that God is the constant in our lives and deaths. He is with us while we live and we live in God when we die. We need to please God first and do what God asks, and be more like God, since he is the constant in our lives. For Sirach, being not angry with one’s neighbor, will bring reward in this life. For Paul, being more Godlike will bring us great reward when we are judged after we die. Christ is Lord of both the dead and the living. We need to prepare now for that life with Christ which will last forever. Not being angry with our neighbor – in fact, loving our neighbor – is what Christ has commanded, and how we become more like God. If we are offended by someone, we have not to look for vengeance in our anger, but we have to realize that the Lord will be the judge, and leave it to him. For God’s



sake, we have to let go and forgive.

This is made very clear by the Gospel today where God is seen to be the role model of forgiveness and someone that we need to be like. It is, in a sense, a dramatic story that illustrates what we say in the Lord’s Prayer every day: forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us. Our forgiveness is based on how we forgive. Because we have been given mercy ourselves, we must in turn give it to others. The message is clear: If we hoard God’s mercy while showing no mercy to others, we risk forfeiting the effects of God’s mercy in our lives.

**Talk to kids about location sharing dangers**

Many popular social media sites offer users the ability to tag or share their locations whenever they post. Depending on the site, this information can be shared with friends, followers, and other people who use the site, regardless of whether they are friends with the user or not. Location sharing is a tool that can be used by predators searching for potential victims. Parents and children need to have open discussions about providing information online, highlighting what is safe to share and when it is safe to do so. As a general rule, widespread location-sharing should be discouraged. 

**SAINT OF THE WEEK**  
**September 16**  
**St. Cornelius (d. 253)**



There was no pope for 14 months after the martyrdom of St. Fabian because of the intensity of the persecution of the Church. During the interval, the Church was governed by a college of priests. St. Cyprian, a friend of Cornelius, writes that Cornelius was elected pope "by the judgment of God and of Christ, by the testimony of most of the clergy, by the vote of the people, with the consent of aged priests and of good men."

The greatest problem of Cornelius's two-year term as pope had to do with the Sacrament of Penance and centered on the readmission of Christians who had apostatized during the time of persecution. Two extremes were finally both condemned. Cyprian, primate of Africa, appealed to the pope to confirm his stand that the relapsed could be reconciled only by the decision of the bishop (against the very indulgent practice of Novatus).

In Rome, however, Cornelius met with the opposite view. After his election, a priest named Novatian (one of those who had governed the Church) had himself consecrated a rival Bishop of Rome—the first antipope. He denied that the Church had any power to reconcile not only the apostates, but also those guilty of murder, adultery, fornication or second marriage! Cornelius had the support of most of the Church (especially of Cyprian of Africa) in condemning Novatianism, though the sect persisted for several centuries. Cornelius held a synod at Rome in 251 and ordered the "relapsed" to be restored to the Church with the usual "medicines of repentance."

The friendship of Cornelius and Cyprian was strained for a time when one of Cyprian's rivals made accusations about him. But the problem was cleared up.

A document from Cornelius shows the extent of organization in the Church of Rome in the mid-third century: 46 priests, seven deacons, seven subdeacons. It is estimated that the number of Christians totaled about 50,000.

A fin de cuentas el brazo del Señor no es corto y seremos juzgados tal y cómo tratamos a otros, y no cómo ellos nos tratan.

¿"Qué es lo que queremos regrese a nosotros?" Nuestra contestación no debe ser meramente palabras sino acciones y actos.

El hombre sabio, Siracide, en nuestra primera lectura, nos dice, "Perdona la injusticia de tu vecino; entonces cuando ores, tus propios pecados serán perdonados." Estas palabras, resuenan en muchos sentidos a la Oración del Señor: "Perdona nuestras deudas así como nosotros perdonamos a nuestros deudores." Hemos indicado que queremos el mismo tratamiento que damos a otros. Usted dispone... trata a otros bien, inclusive aquellos más cercanos a ti, y ellos te tratarán bien en retorno.

El rencor y la cólera no da buenos frutos, por el contrario son abominables. Dejemos de odiar. Vivamos de acuerdo a los mandamientos que Dios nos ha enseñado. "Amar a nuestro prójimo como a nosotros mismos". "Perdonar a los que nos ofenden".

La enseñanza es bastante clara: sólo quien perdona a su prójimo puede esperar el perdón de Dios. El que no está dispuesto a perdonar, demuestra que no tiene un corazón regenerado.
